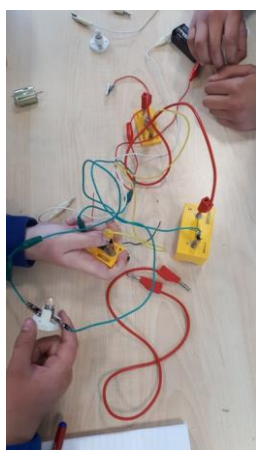


Dear families,

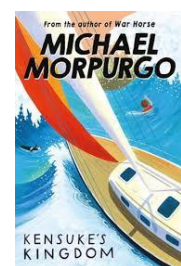
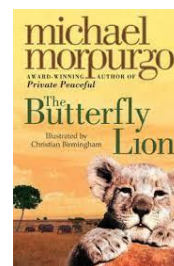
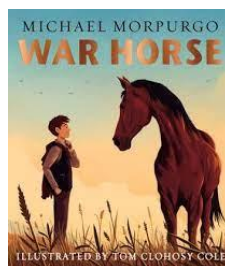
100 Books Challenge
