10 Top Tips for Parents and Educators FAIRPLAY AND FRIENDLY COMPETITION

In school sports, fair play and friendly competition are important for character development. Fair play encompasses respect and integrity while good-natured competition balances rivalry with camaraderie. This guide addresses potential challenges – like the pressure to win – and offers practical tips on instilling values of fair play and cultivating a positive sporting environment for young athletes.

- 1 LEAD BY EXAMPLE**
Parents, coaches and teachers should try to model fair play. Being open to respect for opponents, coaches and officials, children will learn to do the same. Encourage children to play to win, but to play to win with respect. Encourage children to play to win, but to play to win with respect.
- 2 EFFORT OVER OUTCOME**
Encourage children to focus on giving it their all, rather than on winning. Being open to respect for opponents, coaches and officials, children will learn to do the same. Encourage children to play to win, but to play to win with respect.
- 3 SET CLEAR EXPECTATIONS**
Establish clear expectations and consequences for behaviour, during and after sporting events. Encourage children to play to win, but to play to win with respect.
- 4 HIGHLIGHT COOPERATION**
Celebrate the value of teamwork and cooperation in sporting activities. Encourage children to play to win, but to play to win with respect.
- 5 DISCUSS ACCEPTING DEFEAT**
Help children to understand that they will not always win. Encourage children to play to win, but to play to win with respect.
- 6 ENCOURAGE INCLUSIVE PARTICIPATION**
Encourage children to play to win, but to play to win with respect.
- 7 FOSTER CONFLICT RESOLUTION SKILLS**
Encourage children to play to win, but to play to win with respect.
- 8 TEACH RESPECT**
Emphasise to children the importance of respecting everyone involved in the game, regardless of the outcome. Encourage children to play to win, but to play to win with respect.
- 9 GIVE CONSTRUCTIVE FEEDBACK**
Offer feedback that focuses on ways of improving performance rather than on the outcome of the game. Encourage children to play to win, but to play to win with respect.
- 10 CELEBRATE GOOD SPORTSMANSHIP**
It's a great idea to celebrate good sportsmanship, not just good performance. Encourage children to play to win, but to play to win with respect.
