to date on any further precautions that may need to be put in place. Thank you for continuing to wear face coverings for pick up and drop off.

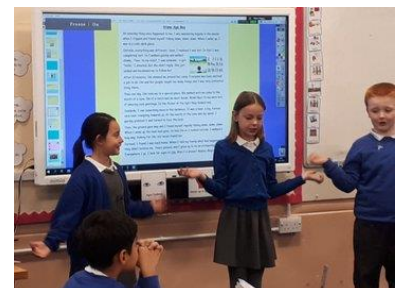
### Our Curriculum
