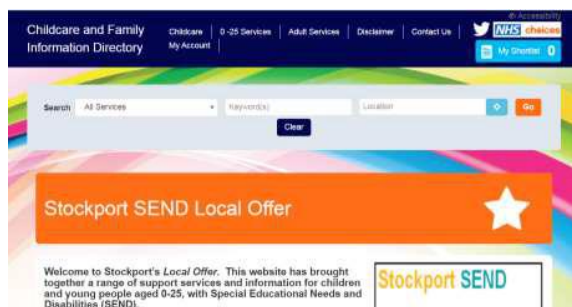
E Safety
