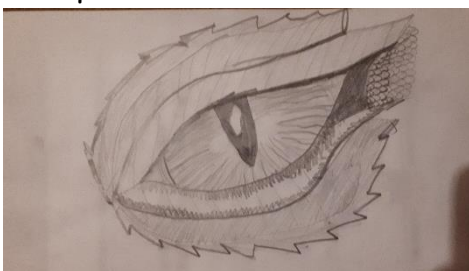
Welcome to Nevill Road Junior School
