Dear Families,

Following on from the announcement that was made last week with regards to all children attending school in September, we have been making extensive plans, which have now been approved by the school governors. Transition

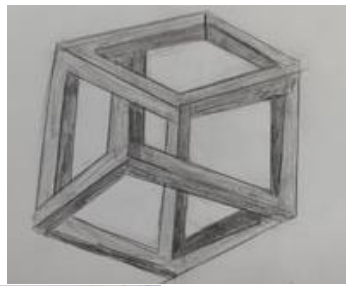
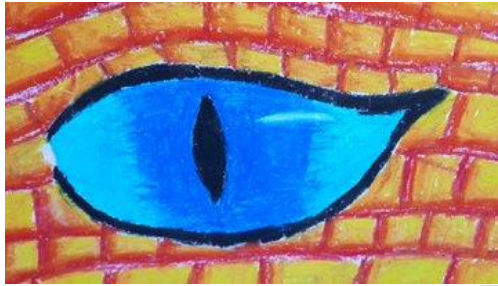

Year 6 Results 2020

This year, the children in Y6 were unable to take their SATS tests but taking in to account their scores on previous SATs paper as well as their performance in class, the teachers have assessed each child in reading, writing and maths. We always knew that the attainment outcomes for the cohort were going to be strong and I am delighted to share the following information:

Key Stage 2 Teacher Assessment Results 2020

Reading	88% meeting expectations 80% National	38% achieving higher level 30% National
Writing	78% meeting expectations 77% National	17% achieving higher level 19% National
Maths	85% meeting expectations 79% National	23% achieving higher level 26% National
