Keeping our Children Safe

Dog on school grounds - as much as we love dogs and puppies we are not allowed to have them on school premises, this includes them being carried. Adults and children may have severe allergies, children can get overexcited and overwhelm even the nicest natured dog and we cannot have any dog going to the toilet on school grounds. Thank you for your understanding.



Sunny Days – please can we ask (on sunny days) that parents apply sunscreen to their child before school and send children in with a sun hat so they can safely enjoy the nice weather. We also recommend that they bring in a water bottle to ensure that they stay hydrated (water only please).

Bikes and scooters – we are a growing school and at the end of the day we have a large number of children and adults using the school grounds. Please be reminded that riding scooter and bikes can be dangerous, particularly with little ones around. Whilst we don't want to discourage travelling to school in this way, we do ask that parents and children dismount from their vehicles as they enter the grounds. We will need to ask individuals to refrain from using vehicles if this request is not followed.

Use of outdoor equipment – Please be reminded that once the Infant children have been passed on to their adult, they are no longer in schools care. Therefore we ask that children are supervised on the outdoor equipment at the Junior school, at all times to ensure that no accidents take place. Many thanks for your support in keeping our children safe.
